



There's so much to explore when you're outside! You and your family can enjoy going on a nature walk and talking about the things you see. Look at the pictures below. How many of these things can you find?




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# **Gadget Gurus**



#### What you need:

- Pencil and eraser
- **Recyclables:** cardboard boxes, plastic bottles, tin cans, newspapers/magazine, old toys, or other objects (don't use if there are sharp edges)
- Joiners: tape, glue, string, wire, pipe, cleaners
- **Decorators:** paint, crayons, markers, stickers, and other craft supplies
- **Cutters:** scissors, hole punchers, etc. Be sure to use a grownup helper!



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
# What Do You Hear?



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
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


# **Story Cubes**
